Dear Dr. Ould-Mey:

I am systematically evaluating all papers received from David Slater's office in Loughborough, including accepted (but not yet published) papers, and those currently in review since Dr. Slater is no longer associated with the journal. I am reading all papers and all referee reports as well as communications between David Slater and the authors.

Some papers have been evaluated thoroughly and professionally and I have passed these onto the production office for entry to the publication queue. Others remain in the early stages of review with no decisions yet available. A third category of submissions, including yours, need further review before a final decision can be made about whether they meet the usual PG standards for acceptance.

Like other authors in the third category, you have the choice of withdrawing the paper if you don't wish it to undergo further review. I have some comments on the paper as well that I would be happy to send to you if you want to make further amendments before I sending it out to three reviewers.
